## Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission approve a motion accepting a donation of artwork as described below from the James Winder Laird Trust, for exhibition in the Henry E. Kinney Tunnel Top Park ("Tunnel Top Park"), and authorizing the City Manager, in consultation with the City Attorney, to negotiate and enter into an Escrow Agreement for the commissioning, purchase, installation, and future maintenance, of public art, on behalf of the City of Fort Lauderdale.

### **Background**

On October 14, 2022, the Trustee of the James Winder Laird Trust, Jeffrey Seth Selzer, Esq., notified the City of a specific bequest of \$5,000,000 worth of artwork to the City, encompassing the commissioning, purchase, installation and future maintenance of public art at Tunnel Top Park. This bequest is contingent upon:

- Placing a plague in Tunnel Top Park notating that the artwork throughout Tunnel Top Park was at the beguest of the James Winder Laird Trust and designating the space as the "James Winder Laird Arts Park." The park itself will retain the name Henry E. Kinney Tunnel Top Park.
- Noting the donor as the James Winder Laird Trust on each artwork's identifying plaque.
- The first two acquisitions being:
  - o Marc Quinn, Broken Sublime (The Hunger), with a purchase price of \$650,000.00, exclusive of shipping, engineering, site-work, and installation
  - R&R Studios, FTL, with a commissioning cost of \$350,000.00 exclusive of foundation cost.

- The remaining funds, approximately \$3,500,000.00, being transferred to an escrow account and the City entering into an escrow agreement with the Trust to oversee the use of all funds.
- The Trust and its art advisor will select and propose subsequent artworks and sites to the Public Art & Placement Advisory Board for approval and recommendation to the City Commission.

Following the purchase of each piece of art, the artworks title, a deed of gift, will be transferred to the City.

## Resource Impact

This action will result in a positive fiscal impact to the City. The amount of the donation is \$5,000,000 worth of artwork; however, no funds will be directly transferred to the City.
