**TITLE**: Motion Approving a Retroactive Agreement for the Riverwalk Floating Dock

Construction Phase II – Florida Floats, Inc. d/b/a Bellingham Marine – 485-

Day Extension – (Commission District 2)

#### **Recommendation**

Staff recommends the City Commission approve a Retroactive Agreement with Florida Floats, Inc. d/b/a Bellingham Marine for the Riverwalk Floating Dock Construction Phase II Project, with a 485-day extension ending on April 11, 2025.

## **Background**

On October 3, 2022, the City Commission awarded a Proprietary Purchase to Florida Floats, Inc. d/b/a Bellingham Marine, in the amount of \$422,890 for the manufacturing and installation of a floating dock on the north side of Riverwalk by the Esplanade Park (CAM #22-0845). The purpose of this project is to install one (1) additional section of dock and two (2) access ramps between the existing dockage at Esplanade Park to increase downtown waterway access. This project, like the original dock installation project (CAM #21-1116), will be partially funded by the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) grant.

The executed agreement from October 3, 2022, does not include the number of days for completion nor an expiration date.

A Notice to Proceed (NTP) was issued on April 7, 2023, designating December 13, 2023, as the final completion date. On December 13, 2023, the manufacturing of the dock was completed but there were formal complaints from Florida Power and Light (FPL) about the proposed locations of the pilings. The original design placed the necessary pilings outside the FPL easement, but FPL rejected the locations indicating the piles were "too close". Bellingham Marine has been working with FPL to accommodate its long list of requirements.

The 485-day extension, ending on April 11, 2025, is requested to allow for potential additional delays for the fall and winter events in the Riverwalk area during the months of November and December.

## **Resource Impact**

There is no fiscal impact to the City for this new Agreement.
