Removal Services Annual Contract for Retroactive Compensation Increase - Imperial Electrical Incorporated - \$75,000 - (Commission Districts 1, 2,

3 and 4)

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the City Commission approve a First Amendment to Agreement for Pole Setting and Removal Services, Annual Contract, with Imperial Electrical Incorporated ("Service Agreement"), in substantially the form attached, to authorize an increase to the current annual compensation amount of \$123,785 by an additional annual compensation amount of \$75,000, for a combined total annual compensation amount of \$198,785, subject to the same terms, conditions, and specifications contained in the Agreement, including any subsequent renewal terms that are mutually agreed to in a writing executed by both Parties.

Background

On December 15, 2020, the City Commission approved CAM #20-0883, an Agreement for Pole Setting and Removal Services, Bid Contract No. 12452-513, with an estimated annual amount of \$123,785 and three (3) one (1)-year renewal options.

The Parks and Recreation Department utilizes this contract to install light poles throughout the City that are damaged either from age (wear and tear), vehicle accidents, and natural disasters. Imperial Electrical Incorporated (Imperial) provides pole removal and new pole installation as needed for projects. Imperial work on poles with a normal basis range in size from 20 feet to 90 feet in height. The contractor has the specialized equipment and experience needed to make these installations whereas Parks and Recreation maintenance crews are more suited to handle smaller maintenance repair items.

During the second renewal term of the contract for the period of April 22, 2023, through April 21, 2024, the contract amount of \$123,785 has been exhausted due to invoices received after the Fiscal Year end budget cycle. Parks and Recreation currently has \$38,925 due in outstanding invoices. It is estimated that an additional \$75,000 is needed
