TITLE: Ordinance Amending the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort
Lauderdale Relating to Traffic and Parking

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve an ordinance on first reading to amend the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale Relating to Traffic and Parking.

Background

With several changes in the way the Transportation and Mobility Department's Parking Services Division conducts business it has become necessary to complete a revision of Chapter 26, Traffic and Parking, of the Code of Ordinances.

The changes include:

- At Cox's Landing 15th Street Boat Launch restricting the length of vehicles pulling boat trailers parking at length-restricted spaces and imposing fines for exceeding maximum lengths posted
- Prohibiting non-EV vehicles from parking in spaces designated as electric vehicle charging stations
- Restricting "back in parking" in order not to impede the operation of Parking Enforcement vehicles equipped with License Plate Technology equipment
- Providing for additional definitions for Designation Resolution, Dwelling Unit, Guest, Guest Permit, Residence, Resident, Residential Area, Residential Parking Permit, Parking Services Manager, Payment, Residential Parking Permit District, Restricted Street, and Visitor
- Revising all references to "Director of Parking and Fleet Services" to "Director of Transportation and Mobility"

Resource Impact

There will be no fiscal impact associated with this action.
