**TITLE:** Resolution – Interlocal Agreement with the Housing Authority of the City of Fort Lauderdale

**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution authorizing the proper City officials to execute an Interlocal Agreement with the Housing Authority of the City of Fort Lauderdale (HACFL), in substantially the form attached, to support the City’s Chronic Homelessness Housing Collaborative (CHHC) Project; effective January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014.

**Background**

On December 17, 2013, the City Commission approved accepting and entering into a grant agreement with Broward County in the amount of \$440,117 and the execution of any documents associated with such funds, for the CHHC Project.

The roles and responsibilities are as follows:

HACFL’s Responsibilities	City’s Responsibilities
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide a minimum of 22 housing units, twenty (20) one- bedroom and two (2) two-bedroom units for the project</li> <li>• Provide .5 FTE Maintenance Technician to assure quality living standards of housing units</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pay rental payments for the 22 units in the amount of \$248,304</li> <li>• Provide for start-up costs including but not limited to moving expenses and furniture</li> </ul>

HACFL is a governmental agency and pursuant to the City Code of Ordinances Section 2-189(c) may be exempt from the City’s competitive process.
