TITLE: Motion Approving Agreements for Request for Qualifications No. 423-2, Bridge Design and Miscellaneous Structural Engineering Services, Continuing Services Contract - Various Contractors - \$2,438,000 (Three Year Aggregate) - **(Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)**

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission approve agreements, in substantially the forms attached, with Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc.; CHA Consulting, Inc.; Michael Baker International, Inc.; and R.J. Behar & Company, Inc. for Request for Qualifications No. 423-2, Bridge Design and Miscellaneous Structural Engineering Services – Continuing Services Contracts, for an initial three (3)-year term with an estimated aggregate amount of \$2,438,000; and further authorize the City Manager to execute said agreements and approve two (2) additional one (1)-year renewal options for an estimated annual renewal aggregate amount of \$812,666.67, for a potential total cumulative contract amount of \$4,063.333.34, contingent upon the appropriation of funds.

Background

The City of Fort Lauderdale owns fifty-three (53) bridges. According to the Bridge Master Plan (August 2025), three (3) City-owned bridges have reached a point where continued maintenance is no longer cost-effective and are therefore slated for full replacement:

- NE 1st Street Bridge
- SE 13th Street Bridge
- Bayview Longboat Inlet Bridge

On February 18, 2025, the City, via the Procurement Services Division, issued Request for Qualifications (RFQ) 423-2 – Bridge Design and Miscellaneous Structural Engineering Services to design replacement structures.

On March 27, 2025, the RFQ closed with a total of five (5) firms submitting proposals:

1. CHA Consulting, Inc.
2. Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc.

3. Michael Baker International, Inc.
4. R.J. Behar & Company, Inc.
5. Lakdas / Yohalem Engineering, Inc.

On June 2, 2025, the Evaluation Committee (Committee) met to evaluate the proposals. The firms were ranked based on the evaluation criteria shown in the table below.

CRITERIA	WEIGHT (%)
Qualifications of the Firm and Team	25%
Experience and Past Performance with Bridge Design and Miscellaneous Structural Engineering Services	35%
Approach to Scope of Work	30%
Workload of the Firm	10%
TOTAL:	100%

The following top four (4) firms were shortlisted for presentations:

- CHA Consulting, Inc.
- Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc.
- Michael Baker International, Inc.
- R.J. Behar & Company, Inc.

On June 30, 2025, the shortlisted firms conducted presentations before the Evaluation Committee. The firms were evaluated and ranked based on the evaluation criteria shown in the table above.

Following presentations and scoring, the Evaluation Committee recommended award to all four (4) shortlisted firms.

Negotiations were successfully completed, and all firms agreed to fixed rates for the term of the Agreement. Staff recommends award to CHA Consulting, Inc.; Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc.; Michael Baker International, Inc.; and R.J. Behar & Company, Inc.

Resource Impact

There will be a current fiscal year impact to the City in the amount of \$2,438,000. Funds for these Agreements are available in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 Community Investment Plan in the accounts listed below. Future task order funding is contingent upon the approval and appropriation of the annual budgets.
