**TITLE**: Consent Resolution - License Agreement Allowing the Florida Department

of Transportation to Access City Property - Holiday Park at Sunrise

Boulevard and NE 10 Avenue

#### RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution allowing the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to access a portion of Holiday Park along US-1 for the purposes of sloping, grading, tying in, harmonizing and reconnecting existing features of the City property with the roadway improvements.

## **Background**

FDOT has a resurfacing project along US-1 (Sunrise Boulevard) from Broward Boulevard to NE 17<sup>th</sup> Way. In order to reconnect the driveway at NE 10 Avenue (entryway into Holiday Park) with the existing sidewalk, FDOT requires a license agreement with the City to access the property. This license agreement does not convey an easement or permanent rights to the property.

The resurfacing project is set to begin construction in March of 2015. This agreement will be in effect until the completion of the resurfacing project, but no later than July 31, 2019.

### **Resource Impact**

There is no resource impact at this time.
