**TITLE**: Public Hearing - Resolution Approving the Transfer and Use of Parks Bond

Land Acquisition Allocations Toward Improvements for Carter Park

(Commission District 3)

## **Recommendation**

Staff recommends that the City Commission adopt a resolution authorizing the transfer and use of Parks Bond land acquisition fund allocations in the amount of \$7,300,000 assigned to District 3 to finance improvements to Carter Park.

## **Background**

Carter Park is listed as one of the Parks Bond Signature Parks. The main vision of the park is to consolidate multiple single purpose buildings throughout the site into one larger multi-functional regional community center. Additionally, the plan proposes to replace and improve several amenities throughout the park including the playground, splash pad and artificial turf field.

While the original allocation from the bond was \$13.6M. Over time, the project's scope and associated cost estimates were refined, and due to current market conditions, the design consultant had to continually value engineer the project. This led to a significant reduction of the scope, including eliminating many of the proposed amenities, and reducing the square footage of the community center by half, which would have resulted in replacing the existing buildings with a new consolidated community center, of similar size to what is currently on the property.

To stay true to the original vision for the park as a signature project, it was determined that an additional \$9.3M, (\$7.3M Bond land acquisition, and \$2.0M Park Impact Fees) was needed beyond the original funds of \$13.6M, and CRA funds and grants already secured by Staff in the amount of \$2.2M to support the project, for an estimated total program cost of \$25.1M.

At the December 19, 2023 Commission meeting, staff discussed the use of Parks Bond land acquisition allocations for improvements to Carter Park. With Commission approval,

the request was brought before the Parks, Recreation and Beaches Advisory Board on January 24, 2024. The item passed unanimously 10-0.

District 3 has a remaining balance of approximately \$7,369,000 all of which will go towards bridging the current funding gap for this project.

## **Resource Impact**

There is a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$7,300,000. This is associated with Consolidated Budget Amendment CAM 24-0036 which was previously approved on March 6, 2024.
