**TITLE**: Motion to approve proprietary purchase of annual support for the Lucas

Chest Compression System - \$26,350

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the proprietary purchase of annual support for the Lucas Chest Compression System in the annual amount of \$26,350 from Physio-Control, Inc. and approve the agreement in substantially the form attached.

# **Background**

The Lucas Chest Compression System is a device that is used to deliver steady and consistent sternal compressions in the cardiac arrest patient. The LUCAS 2 performs chest compressions far more efficiently and effectively than the most highly trained professional. Equally important, the LUCAS frees caregivers' hands so they can perform other life-saving interventions.

At its March 2, 2010 Regular Meeting (CAR 10-0289, MD-04) the City Commission approved the initial purchase of thirteen LUCAS 2 units. The City Commission also approved an additional four units at its April 5, 2011 meeting (CAR 11-0476, MD-03). The initial warranty period for these seventeen units has since expired and the Fire-Rescue Department requests a technical service support agreement (annual maintenance contract) be executed for Fiscal Year 2014 in the amount of \$26,350. The effective date of this maintenance contract will be October 1, 2013 and ending September 30, 2014.

# **Resource Impact**

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$26,350.
