WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 24-182, adopted on September 12, 2024, the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, adopted the City of Fort Lauderdale's FY 2025 Final All Funds Budget for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 24-172, adopted on September 12, 2024, the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, adopted the City of Fort Lauderdale Final FY 2025 - FY 2029 Community Investment Plan for the Fiscal Years beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2029;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That the City of Fort Lauderdale's FY 2025 Final All Funds Budget for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025, as amended, is hereby amended by appropriating funds as set forth in City Commission Agenda Memo #25-0095, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. That the City of Fort Lauderdale Final FY 2025 - FY 2029 Community Investment Plan for the Fiscal Years beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2029, as amended, to the extent appropriated for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025, is hereby amended by appropriating funds as set forth in City Commission Agenda Memo #25-0095.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt a resolution amending the Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 Operating Budget and the FY 2025 – FY 2029 Community Investment Plan (CIP).

Background

Recommended actions within the budget amendment include appropriations from fund balance.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2025 Final Budget, and the FY 2025 – FY 2029 Community Investment Plan, by approving the following appropriations:

Parks and Recreation

A. Appropriation from Fund Balance – Tree Canopy Trust Fund, General Fund – Tree and Palm Purchases During FY 2025 – \$179,933 (Citywide)

The City's Tree Canopy Trust Fund is dedicated to enhancing tree canopy coverage. Subsection 47-21.2.A.66 of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, Unified Land Development Regulations, provides in part: "Trust funds shall be expended, utilized and disbursed for the planting of trees and any other ancillary costs associated with the planting of trees on public lands."

The Parks and Recreation Department oversees the purchase of trees, palms, and essential materials such as mulch, tree grates, and relocation services to ensure proper installation and long-term maintenance of tree planting projects. Since the beginning of the fiscal year, the Department has replaced/planted 259 trees.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2025 Operating Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the General Fund, in the amount of \$179,933 to enhance the City's tree canopy coverage.

B. Appropriation from Fund Balance – Sewer Expansion/Impact Fee Construction Fund – NE 38th Street 42-Inch Force Main/NE 19th Avenue 24-Inch Force Main Replacement – \$1,200,000 (District 1)

On October 17, 2023, the City Commission approved a design-build agreement for the NE 38th Street 42-inch Force Main and NE 19th Avenue 24-Inch Force Main Replacement project. This project involves the replacement of approximately 7,900 linear feet of force mains along NE 38th Street, between NE 12th Avenue and Repump Station B. The project also includes the installation of 3,750 linear feet of new force main along NE 50th Court.

This project is currently budgeted at \$38,189,144. Additional funding is now being requested to cover increased construction costs due to unforeseen field conditions encountered during construction, as well as in-house project management expenses and additional construction, engineering, and inspection (CEI) fees needed to complete the project.

Funding is available in the Sewer Expansion/Impact Fee Construction Fund.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2025 – FY 2029 Community Investment Plan to allocate an additional \$1,200,000 to support these costs for the NE 38th Street and NE 19th Avenue Force Main Replacement project. A change order for this item is scheduled to be presented at the June 17, 2025 Commission meeting.

C. Appropriation from Fund Balance – Fleet Services Fund – Purchase of 24 Ford F150 Police Vehicles and the Associated Vehicle Upfitting - \$1,847,060 (Citywide)

The Fleet Services Division of the Public Works Department has identified 24 Police pursuit rated vehicles that have exceeded their useful life and require replacement. The vehicles being replaced are primarily Dodge Chargers and Chevy Tahoes, which have high mileage and extensive engine hours.

Replacement units are being purchased in advance of the normal replacement schedule to minimize the out-of-service time for these vehicles as well as any anticipated repair costs. This investment directly supports public safety and helps ensure operational readiness across the department.

Funding is available in the Fleet Services Fund Balance to advance the purchase of these vehicles. The City's Vehicle Replacement Plan will be revised to reflect this adjustment.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2025 Operating Budget in the amount of \$1,847,060 to advance the purchase of 24 replacement vehicles to support Police operations.
