Recommendation

Staff recommends settlement of these workers' compensation claims in the amount of \$299,753.45 to Raymon Hall.

Background

Raymon Hall was employed as a Police Officer with the City until he retired in 2011. During his twenty-three year career he reported several injuries of which three claims remain open. Exposure to the City for the three claims for future lifetime medical care and indemnity payments is estimated at \$927,755.

A settlement was reached to resolve the three remaining claims with Mr. Hall for a total of \$299,753.45. This includes a \$156,904.45 payment to Mr. Hall; \$89,599 to fund a medicare set aside trust (MSA) to pay for Mr. Hall's future medical care; and \$53,250 in attorney fees to Mr. Hall's attorney.
