Agreements with the Department of Health-Broward County for Open and Closed Points of Dispensing Locations - (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3)

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission approve a motion authorizing the City Manager to execute two Memorandum of Agreements with the Department of Health-Broward County (BCDOH) for Open and Closed Points of Dispensing (PODs) locations.

Background

The City of Fort Lauderdale and the Department of Health-Broward County have had a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) in place since 2014, which is up for renewal December 31, 2021. The Agreements identify certain PODs which are designed to provide resources to survivors in areas where existing services have been lost or overwhelmed due to disaster. PODs will support basic human needs of food, water and mass prophylaxis, if needed.

During 2004 and 2005 hurricane seasons multiple hurricanes struck the continental United States within weeks of each other. The series of disasters stretched the response capabilities of local, state and federal governments, as well as vendors that provide relief supplies and equipment. When local populations are affected by the potential loss of life sustaining infrastructure, this situation places an immediate expectation and requirement on the City Fort Lauderdale and other governmental organizations to provide such life-sustaining commodities to our affected neighbors. It is incumbent for the City of Fort Lauderdale to have plans in place to manage the receipt, staging, distribution and repackaging of disaster relief supplies

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact to the City with this action.
