**TITLE**: Reimagining City Hall Guiding Principles from the Infrastructure Task Force

Advisory Committee - (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

At the August 22, 2023 Joint Commission Workshop with the Infrastructure Task Force (ITF) Advisory Committee, the City Commission requested that the ITF outline guiding principles and propose a vision to guide future decision making on the development of a new City Hall. The ITF, in partnership with the Office of Management and Budget, Dickey Consulting Services, Inc., and the American Institute of Architects student chapter at Florida Atlantic University, conducted extensive outreach with neighbors through a series of five public workshops and surveys to better understand community needs and desires for a new City Hall.

Following the public workshops and surveys, the ITF reviewed the collected input to establish a series of guiding principles for the City Commission to consider as they plan for a new City Hall. A draft summary of the ITF's guiding principles is provided in Exhibit 1.
