TITLE: First Reading - Ordinance Amending Section 2-151 of the Code of

Ordinances Relating to the Settlement of Claims - (Commission Districts

1, 2, 3 and 4)

#### **Recommendation**

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt the attached ordinance amending the Code of Ordinances to revise the approval process.

### **Background**

Currently, Section 2-151, Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, provides four different levels of authority for settlement of claims. The first level is for claims that do not exceed \$10,000 and requires the approval of the risk manager. The second level is for claims that do not exceed \$50,000 and requires approval of the city manager and city attorney. The third level is for claims that do not exceed \$100,000 and requires approval of the city manager, risk manager, and one (1) member of the city commission. The fourth level is for claims that exceed \$100,000 and requires approval of the city commission.

The Staff's recommendation is to add the risk manager as one of the required approvers at the second level and add the city attorney as one of the required approvers at the third level. This change will provide additional and appropriate oversight but will not hinder the approval process.

### Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact to the City.
