- **TITLE:** Motion to approve and Execute Task Order #4 with T.Y. Lin International in the amount of \$45,288 for the Powerline Road Lane Reduction Application to FDOT

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve Task Order # 4 with T.Y. Lin International in the amount of \$45,288 for professional engineering services for the Powerline Road Lane Reduction Application to FDOT.

Background

FDOT is in the process resurfacing Powerline Road north of Sunrise Boulevard to NW 29th Street in Wilton Manors. As a part of this project, City staff has asked that FDOT provide a buffered bike lane along the corridor. In order to accomplish this goal, a lane reduction approval is required.

FDOT District 4 has developed a Lane Reduction Application which is required to be followed by any community requesting a lane reduction on a state roadway and requires a traffic analysis to ensure that no adverse impacts are created. Staff is requesting engineering assistance from T.Y. Lin International to conduct the study necessary to determine if a lane reduction is possible to provide bike lanes without adverse impacts.

City staff will be conducting outreach with the adjacent neighborhood associations of South Middle River and Lauderdale Manors. City staff has also reached out to the City of Wilton Manors to coordinate on the portion of the project that crosses into their city to complete the connectivity across our boundary.

This task order is anticipated to take approximately two months to complete, the FDOT approval process will take an additional two months, and construction anticipated by the end of 2014.

Resource Impact

There is a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$45,288.
