## **RESOLUTION NO. 12-244**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, RECOMMENDING THAT "PROJECT ORANGE" BE APPROVED AS A QUALIFIED TARGET INDUSTRY BUSINESS APPLICANT PURSUANT TO SECTION 288.106, FLORIDA STATUTES; PROVIDING THAT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$140,000 ARE AVAILABLE AS LOCAL FINANCIAL SUPPORT AS PROVIDED HEREIN; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Project Orange is an existing Fort Lauderdale business seeking support for an expansion that would create jobs and increase the city's tax base; and

WHEREAS, if approved for this incentive, the company would hire an additional 200 employees with an average salary of \$84,678; and

WHEREAS, the total QTI incentive award is \$1,400,000, of which the State of Florida would provide 80% and the remaining 20%, the local financial support, would be split equally between Broward County and the City of Fort Lauderdale;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

- <u>SECTION 1</u>. That the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, hereby recommends that "Project Orange" be approved as a Qualified Target Industry Business pursuant to Section 288.106, Florida Statutes.
- <u>SECTION 2</u>. That the City Commission has determined the basis of the project's average private sector wage commitment calculation shall be 200% of the Broward County average wage (\$84,678).
- SECTION 3. That the necessary commitment of local financial support for the Qualified Target Industry Business for the Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Program exists in the amount of \$140,000 in DSD050101-4299, Other Contributions-Fund 001, Subfund 01; that this amount will be available in accordance with the guidelines set forth by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity with the stipulation that these funds are intended to represent a portion of the "local financial support" required by Section 288.106, Florida Statutes.

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SECTION 4. That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon final passage.
