She earned her teaching degree from Florida State and quickly relocated back to Fort Lauderdale in the 1970's. It's so beautiful and picturesque that the film Hoot, written by Carl Hiassen and Jimmy Buffet, choose 18<sup>th</sup> street to represent the neighborhood in the movie where the children lived and chased alongside their school bus. Robin's home was featured in this portion of the movie.

The house has been continually improved over the years, inside and out without changing the architectural charm of the early 50's prevalent throughout the neighborhood. Over the years the house has received a new roof, new windows and new cobble paver driveway.

Most recently Robin has added a new full light hurricane impact front door, added new landscape and updated the lawn including taking advantage of the swale improvement project provided by the City. Now Ms. Rohrs has one of the most lovely, well-kept homes on the block and is a tribute to her community both as a resident and professional educator.
