TITLE:	Resolution Granting a Waiver of Limitations at 1909 SE 21 <sup>st</sup> Avenue for the installation of two (2) finger piers and two (2) mooring piles

### **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a Resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations for the installation of two (2) finger piers and two (2) mooring piles.

## **Background**

The applicant is seeking a resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations (a waiver to allow mooring structures to extend beyond the maximum distance as defined by City Code) of Section 47-19.3 (C) and (D) of the Unified Land Development Regulations (ULDR) for the installation of a two (2) finger piers and two (2) mooring piles extending a maximum distance of +/- 45.5 feet from the property line into Lake Mabel.

Although there is not a fee associated with obtaining a Waiver of Limitations, an application fee in the amount of \$300.00 is required. The summary description specifies that the additional distance for the finger piers and pilings are necessary to safely moor vessels, especially during high wind events and severe weather. In addition, the finger piers are required to safely board and disembark resident's vessel.

The Marine Advisory Board (MAB) recommended approval of the application 11 to 0 (see Exhibit 3). Due to Hurricane Irma, the September 7, 2017 the MAB meeting was cancelled, therefore Draft minutes are attached to this CAM.

### Resource Impact

There is a positive fiscal impact in the amount of \$300 revenue.
