TITLE: Motion to Approve an Agreement with School Board of Broward County

for Use of School Buses for City Recreational Programs and Events – May

1, 2018 through May 31, 2022

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve an agreement, in substantially the form attached, with the School Board of Broward County for use of their school buses for programs and events from May 1, 2018 through May 31, 2022.

Background

The Parks and Recreation Department is requesting authorization to enter into an agreement with the School Board of Broward County to provide bus transportation when needed for our recreational programs and events. As an example, this agreement could be used for transporting children on athletic teams or to special events. The City agrees to fully reimburse the School Board at the School Board's posted transportation rate of \$70 per hour and the bus attendant rate of \$28 per hour.

The agreement requires that the City indemnify the School Board to the limits of the law for any incidents involving property damage or personal injury to a passenger if that injury or damage is caused by an act or omission of an employee of the City and for any liability resulting from the City's failure to comply with the background screening requirements of the Florida Statutes contained therein. Nothing in the Agreement serves as a waiver of sovereign immunity.

The term of this agreement will be May 1, 2018 through May 31, 2022.

Pursuant to Section 2-176 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, the competitive solicitation process shall not apply to contracts with, and purchases from other public entities, i.e.: public state colleges, public state universities, federal government agencies, state governments, county governments, government school boards, county sheriff's offices, and other government entities.

Resource Impact

There will be a fiscal impact to the City for fiscal year 2018 in the amount of \$5,000. Future expenditures are contingent upon approval and appropriation of the FY2019 annual budget.
