

CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE
PROPOSED / DRAFT ANNUAL ACTION
PLAN OF THE CONSOLIDATED
PLAN (FY 2017-2018)

Every five years, the City of Fort Lauderdale is required to submit its Consolidated Plan to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in order to continue receiving funding for the City's Entitlement Grant Programs. The Consolidated Plan provides direction for the City's use of funds under the following programs:

- HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME);
- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG); and
- Housing Opportunities for Persons with HIV/AIDS (HOPW A).

The purpose of the Consolidated Plan is to identify community, economic and housing development needs, and to develop strategies and goals to address those needs with anticipated funding from HUD federal programs over the next five years.

Each year, the City of Fort Lauderdale is required to submit an Annual Action Plan to HUD in order to receive funding for the City's Entitlement Grant Programs. Congress has released preliminary entitlement allocations for the 2017-2018 fiscal year. The 2017-2018 estimated allocations from HUD have not been announced, however, using the prior year's award amounts we anticipate the funding awards to be consistent with the following:

HOME	\$ 471,564.00
CDBG	\$ 1,475,549.00
HOPWA	\$ 7,136,480.00

The draft 2017-2018 Annual Action Plan will be available for public review during a 30-day comment period, beginning May 5, 2017 and ending June 4, 2017 at the City's Housing and Community Development Office at 914 Sistrunk Blvd., Fort Lauderdale, FL 33311, Monday through Friday, from 9:00 am to 4:30 pm.
