**TITLE**: Resolution Approving SW 20<sup>th</sup> Street to be also known as Denison Way

between SW 9th Avenue and SW 19th Avenue - (Commission District 4)

# Recommendation

Staff recommends that the City Commission adopt a resolution approving SW 20<sup>th</sup> Street to be also known as Denison Way between SW 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue and SW 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

### Background

Commissioner Sorensen, with support from the River Oaks Civic Association, requested that the City honor the late Franklin (Frank) and Gertrude Denison by designating a section of SW 20<sup>th</sup> Street with a secondary name of "Denison Way". Frank and Gertrude Denison were pioneers in the yachting industry, revered as key contributors to the reputation Fort Lauderdale holds as the "Yachting Capital of the World". For over forty years, the Denisons built super yachts on the south fork of the New River and were the largest yacht builders in South Florida through the 1950's, until the sale of their yachting company in 1999.

In 1948, Frank and Gertrude purchased Dooley's Basin and Dry Dock while visiting Fort Lauderdale on their honeymoon. The Denisons renamed Dooley's Basin to Broward Marine, which became the largest employer in Broward County and the state of Florida's largest defense contractor. Frank and Gertrude were equally involved in the success of Broward Marine; the yacht and minesweeping building was led by Frank, and Gertrude's interior design expertise set the standard of luxury for the yachts of Broward Marine.

The Denisons had a mantra that stated: "If you build the same boat twice, you haven't learned anything". The unique approach of Broward Marine's design and engineering led the Denisons to shift their focus from their start as a defense contractor, to focus primarily on yacht building over the majority of Broward Marine's years in business.

History Fort Lauderdale honored the Denisons in their "History Makers of 2021" series for their contributions to Fort Lauderdale's yachting industry. The Denisons also received a State of Florida Heritage Site approval, which will allow for a marker to be placed at the Lauderdale Marine Center, honoring the Denison legacy. It is for these reasons, and

many others, that the people impacted by Frank and Gertrude Denison want to memorialize their legacy for years to come through this secondary street renaming.

City staff created a plan that requires nine dual street name signs to be replaced, at nine locations, subject to meeting the technical requirements identified by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and Broward County Traffic Engineering Division. The associated cost based upon the estimate from BCTED for the proposed project is not to exceed \$3,000 which will be funded through the Transportation and Mobility operating budget.

## **Resource Impact**

There will be a fiscal impact associated with this action not to exceed the amount of \$3,000.
