TITLE: Motion approving the acceptance of equipment from the United States
Department of Homeland Security, Urban Area Security Initiative, State of
Florida Division of Emergency Management through the City of Miami, FY
2010 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI), in the amount of \$116,034.96

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a motion authorizing the proper City officials to accept equipment from the United States Department of Homeland Security and the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management and to execute any documents required to accept unique grant equipment between the City of Miami and the City of Fort Lauderdale.

Background

The United States Department of Homeland Security, through the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) has sub-granted the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Grant Program FY 2010 to the City of Miami to provide funds to address the unique equipment, training, planning, exercise and operational needs for large urban areas; and to assist them in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, respond to and recover from the threats or acts of terrorism.

In accordance with the UASI FY 2010 Grant Program, the City of Fort Lauderdale was added to a resolution in the City of Miami and will uphold the Memoranda of Agreement (MOA) which identifies the distribution of equipment by the City of Miami which specifies maintenance and inventory responsibilities in accordance with UASI grant policies.

The City of Fort Lauderdale will accept the following items:

Two (2) MMG205 (IT4) Generators w/ Tandem Trailer(s) at the cost of \$58,017.48 each
= \$116,034.96

Resource Impact
