TITLE:	Quasi-Judicial/Public Hearing/Resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations for Grupo Alco International, LLC / 1100 & 1120 Seminole Drive via ULDR Sections C, D and E.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a Resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations for the installation of an eight slip fixed dock and associated mooring piles over privately owned submerged land for Grupo Alco International, LLC at 1100 & 1120 Seminole Drive.

Background

The applicant is seeking a Resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations (a waiver to allow a dock, mooring structure, or boat lift to extend beyond the maximum distance as defined by City Code) of the Unified Land and Development Regulations (ULDR) Sec. 47-19.3 C and D for the installation of an eight slip fixed dock and associated mooring pilings extending a maximum of 54.7' feet from the wet face of the seawall over privately owned submerged lands. The proposed plan represents a scaled down revision of a dock plan reviewed and recommended for approval by the Marine Advisory Board at its December 5, 2013 meeting, and specifically addresses dock design concerns expressed by the adjacent Coral Cove Association. Although there is not a fee associated with obtaining a Waiver of Limitations, an application fee in the amount of \$300.00 is required. The applicant's narrative indicates the waiver for the dock and pilings are necessary due to the City's interpretation of property line as well as the extraordinary with of the waterway at this location.

In a voice vote, the Marine Advisory Board recommended approval of the application (12:0) (see Exhibit 4).

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.
