TITLE: Motion to approve purchase agreements for seven replacement

playgrounds – U.S. Communities Contracts 110171 and 110179 -

\$648,855.72

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the agreements, in substantially the form attached, for the purchase and installation of five playgrounds from Kompan, Inc. in the amount of \$449,605.75 in accordance with U.S. Communities Contract 110171, and two playgrounds from PlayCore Wisconsin, Inc., d/b/a Gametime in the amount of \$199,249.97 in accordance with U.S. Communities Contract 110179, contingent upon approval of the corresponding budget amendment set forth in City Commission Agenda Memo #14-0090.

Background

The Parks and Recreation Department is requesting approval to purchase the replacement of playground equipment for seven playgrounds throughout the City to provide safe and accessible playgrounds for neighbors and visitors. The playgrounds have exceeded their life cycle. All areas will receive new playground equipment; new or restored to new surfacing; and three new shade structures. The playground replacements will be installed at Bass, Flamingo, Dottie Mancini, Palm Aire, Riverside, Snyder and Virginia Young playgrounds.

Pursuant to Section 2-181(7) of the Code of Ordinances, these purchases of playgrounds will be made in accordance with U.S. Communities Contract 110171 from Kompan, Inc. in the amount of \$449,605.75 and in accordance with U.S. Communities Contract 110179 from PlayCore Wisconsin, Inc., d/b/a Gametime in the amount of \$199,249.97, in conjunction with Mecklenburg County, North Carolina acting as lead agency, whereby such contract or formal bid followed formal bid procedures of sealed written bids, public opening, and legal advertising.

Due to the various sizes of the playgrounds and the actual replacement cost of Bass, Riverside and Dottie Mancini Parks, a transfer of funding is recommended from the other playground replacement projects that are under budget.
