Transportation Engineering Consultant Services Agreements - Contract

616-10631

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission authorize additional funds, in the amount of \$1,098,370, to Contract 616-10631 for professional traffic and transportation engineering consultant services to implement transportation and mobility projects and programs.

Background

Contract 616-10631 includes Agreements with four (4) firms: Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc., Kittelson & Associates, Inc., Miller, Legg & Associates, Inc., and T.Y. Lin International, for professional traffic and transportation and engineering consultant services. Agreements with these firms were initially approved by Commission on July 6, 2011 and August 23, 2011. An amendment that revised the contract language was approved on August 21, 2012. Two extensions were then approved by Commission on May 7, 2013 and July 1, 2014 (Exhibit 1). The July 1, 2014 Commission action included adding \$233,858 in available FY 2014 transportation operating funds to go towards operating activities such as the development of neighborhood mobility masterplans and for the review of development traffic and parking impact studies as part of the development review committee process.

As staff plans to advance the many initiatives included within the FY 2015 Transportation Work Program, additional funds need to be added to the overall contract. Funds are needed to provide support for traffic and parking reviews as part of the development review committee, planning and design for specific Community Investment Plan (CIP) projects, and for planning, project management, and engineering support (Exhibit 2).

Project task order issuance with each of the consultants will be done in accordance with the Competitive Consultants Negotiation Act (CCNA) as it relates to continuing services contracts, as defined by Section 287,055, Florida Statutes. Professional services

proposed do not exceed \$200,000 for each individual study/project and the estimated construction value does not exceed \$2 million cost for each study/project. In addition, the contract is for a fixed term.

Resource Impact

There is an estimated resource impact to the City in the amount of \$1,098,370. Funding for these services will be from individual projects and operating budgets when services are contracted through individual task orders subject to the availability of funds.
