Goal: To build trust and instill a feeling of safety when individuals experiencing homelessness interact with officers.

- Out of 485 officers, 97% have completed Homeless Awareness Training.
- Two officers are assigned to the Homeless Outreach Team. They are responsible for patrolling the City to provide outreach to homeless individuals, following-up on neighbor/business inquiries, and connecting those in need with Community Court.

Goal: To address low-level misdemeanor offenses and violations of municipal ordinances by providing community service opportunities in lieu of incarceration.

*Impact has broadened to accommodate walk-ins

Goal: To provide field outreach, complete intake assessments, and connect homeless individuals with appropriate services for housing.

In three months, we have linked 60% of our identified cohort to services
