TITLE: A motion to approve a Maintenance Memorandum of Agreement for sidewalk and landscaping maintenance at the SW corner of Commercial Boulevard (SR-870) and Federal Highway (SR-5), State Section 86020, State Road 5 with the Department of Transportation

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission authorize the execution of a Maintenance Memorandum of Agreement, in substantial form, attached hereto as Exhibit "1", for sidewalk and landscaping maintenance at the SW corner of Commercial Boulevard (SR-870) and Federal Highway (SR-5), State Section 86020, State Road 5 with the Department of Transportation.

Background

The Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is an agreement for the City to maintain specific elements constructed under Project Number 2013-L-491-0004. The permit allows for the reconstruction and relocation of sidewalk and landscaping as detailed in Exhibit "A" of the Memorandum of Agreement. The sidewalk is being constructed within the perpetual easement. These improvements are part of the site plan for the Bank of America project and follow the City's Complete Street policy.

Resource Impact

There are no additional fiscal impacts as maintenance dollars are already budgeted in Parks and Recreation.

Strategic Connection

This item is a *Press Play Fort Lauderdale Strategic Plan 2018* initiative, included within the Infrastructure Cylinder of Excellence, specifically advancing:

- Goal 1: Be a pedestrian friendly, multi-modal city.
- Objective 1: Integrate transportation land use and planning to create a walkable and bikeable community.
- Initiative 8: Adopt Complete Streets guidelines.

This item advances the *Fast Forward Fort Lauderdale 2035 Vision Plan: We are Connected*.
