TITLE: Motion to approve final ranking and commencement of contract

negotiations for engineering services for River Oaks Neighborhood and Stormwater Preserve Park- Request for Qualifications (RFQ) 246-11389 –

Consultants Competitive Negotiations Act (CCNA)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the final ranking and authorize the commencement of contract negotiations for engineering services for River Oaks Neighborhood and Stormwater Preserve Park with the top ranked proposer Craven, Thompson & Associates, Inc.; and certify Craven, Thompson & Associates, Inc. as qualified pursuant to law and the City's regulations as well as fully qualified to render the required services based on the City staff's recommendation.

Background

The City solicited engineering firms to provide services for River Oaks Neighborhood and Stormwater Preserve Park. The project includes the design, permitting, environmental resources mitigation, surveying and coordination of:

- a) The design of new sustainable stormwater systems for the southern portion of River Oaks Neighborhood between SW 20th Street to the north, State Road 84 to the south, Interstate I-95 to the west, and SW 9th Street to the east (approximate area is 210 acres);
- b) The design of Stormwater Preserve Park's related park amenities (boardwalk, gazebos, parking lot, dock, etc.), and new wetland area (approximate area is 10 acres); and
- c) The preparation of final stormwater calculations for the neighborhood and Stormwater Preserve Park corresponding to the 100% construction documents as required by the various regulatory government agencies.

The timeline for the solicitation process included the following:

- March 2014 RFQ 246-11389 was opened and seven proposals were received from the following firms: CSA Central, Inc., Chen Moore and Associates, Inc., Johnson Engineering, Inc., Craven, Thompson & Associates, Inc., Calvin, Giordano & Associates, Inc., RS&H, Inc., and Miller, Legg & Associates, Inc.
- May 2014 The evaluation committee consisting of Alex Scheffer Senior Project Manager, Todd Hiteshew Environmental Services Manager, Tamira Coffman Assistant Public Works Director, and Marie Pierce Stormwater Operations Manager met with James Hemphill Sr. Procurement Specialist to evaluate and rank the proposers. As a result of the evaluation, the committee selected the following four firms to be shortlisted for oral presentations: Craven, Thompson & Associates, Inc., Calvin, Giordano & Associates, Inc., RS&H, Inc. and Miller, Legg & Associates, Inc.
- June 2014 Each firm was invited to make an oral presentation to the evaluation committee. After the presentations were completed, the committee ranked the proposals based on the evaluation criteria and oral presentations as shown in the table below:
