## Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the imposition of a Special Assessment Lien for the costs associated with cleaning and removal of debris associated with the properties listed in Exhibit 1.

## Background

The properties on the attached list were found to be overgrown or unkempt with trash and debris existing thereon. Notice was provided to the owners to clear the lots within the required time (10 days). After the property owners failed to comply, the City cleared and cleaned the property at a cost of \$ 36,261.60. Invoices have been sent to the property owners and have not been paid.

Staff requests approval by the Commission to impose a Special Assessment Lien pursuant to City Commission Resolution (Exhibit 2) for costs associated with cleaning and removal of the debris in the amount of \$ 36,261.60.
