- WHEREAS, September is No More Homeless Pets Month and, in recognition, local rescue organizations are hosting "DoggiPalooza" an entire month of adoption and dog welfare events where Fort Lauderdale residents will be encouraged to meet some of the adoptable pets housed in our county shelters, and hopefully, take one home.

NOW, THEREFORE, WE, as City Commissioners of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, do hereby proclaim **September 2013** as:

No More Homeless Pets Month

in the City of Fort Lauderdale and do encourage our residents to adopt a pet, and do remind everyone to spay or neuter their pet.
