Recommendation

Staff recommends the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) Board of Commissioners hold a Public Hearing, accepting the development proposal of Sefton and Beverly Chambers; authorize the Executive Director to execute any and all related instruments; and delegate authority to the Executive Director to take certain actions.

Background

On January 18, 2022, the City of Fort Lauderdale transferred surplus scattered sites in the Northwest-Progresso-Flagler Heights (NPF) CRA area to the CRA for affordable housing. The properties were conveyed to the CRA at no cost. Florida Statutes requires cities to prepare an inventory list of City-owned property within its jurisdiction which are deemed appropriate for affordable housing. All properties under the City Affordable Housing Surplus List are dedicated to permanent affordable housing, according to Florida Statutes, and must remain affordable to families not exceeding 120% of the area median income. In response to community stakeholder interest in being able to participate in the redevelopment process, on April 4, 2024, the CRA issued a Notice of Intent to accept proposals and dispose of CRA property at 724 NW 15 Way for Affordable Housing. A copy of the location map, Broward County Property Appraiser information and photos of the property are attached as Exhibit 1, and the Notice of Intent (RFP Notice) published in the Sun Sentinel and Westside Gazette is attached as Exhibit 2

The property at 724 NW 15 Way is zoned RD -15 (Residential Single Family/Duplex/Low-Medium Density District) and contains an 874 square foot deteriorated, vacant single family home constructed in 1961 on a 5,625 square foot parcel. Proposals could include the purchase, rehabilitation and reuse of the existing structure, or demolition and construction of a new residential structure for affordable housing.

On May 6, 2024, a single proposal from Sefton and Beverly Chambers was received for the conveyance and renovation of the existing structure. A copy of the Proposal is attached as Exhibit 3. Their proposal is to purchase the property for \$1.00 and to completely renovate the property at their expense, estimated at approximately \$190,000. The severely deteriorated roof structure, water damaged interior and deteriorated electrical, plumbing and other systems will require the property be completed gutted and rebuilt. The property has a fair market value of \$104,063, based on an appraisal by Vance Real Estate Service as of June 1, 2023 (Exhibit 4). Because of the condition of the property, the appraiser assigned no value to the existing improvements and the valuation represents only the land value.

Sefton Chambers works in the construction industry and is experienced in renovation of this type. Mrs. Chambers is an experienced real estate professional and together the husband and wife team, who live in Dorsey Riverbend, have renovated and sold or managed numerous rental properties. The Chambers will fund the renovations from personal cash equity and line of credit. The Developer's timeline for the project is to commence with development approvals immediately upon award and to complete the project within 8 months.

An Evaluation Committee was established and met on June 24, 2024 to review and score the proposal based on the Evaluation Criteria below as stated in the RFP.

The Evaluation Committee scored the proposal the maximum possible points and approved a motion to award the project to Sefton and Beverly Chambers.

On August 13, 2024, the NPF CRA Redevelopment Advisory Board unanimously recommended approval of this item. A copy of the minutes of the meeting are attached as Exhibit 5. A copy of the Affordable Housing Development Agreement and Purchase Contract and Addendum are attached as Exhibit 6. A copy of the Resolution is attached as Exhibit 7.

Consistency with NPF CRA Community Redevelopment Plan

The Redevelopment Program seeks to preserve and expand affordable housing, commercial development and job opportunities. The NPF CRA Community Redevelopment Plan is designed in part to stimulate private development of areas. The Project is consistent with NPF CRA Plan which provides for direct physical improvements to enhance the overall environment, improve the quality of life, promote public private partnerships, and investment in the area. In addition, per the Future Land Use Plan and CRA Plan, redevelopment and housing opportunities for low and moderate income households within the CRA should be encouraged.

Land assembly may be used as a government intervention technique or predominant method of redevelopment programming to foster private redevelopment. In connection with those programs, projects or activities where land assembly for private disposition and use is deemed appropriate, the purpose, intent and objectives of the Redevelopment Plan shall be protected and preserved by the incorporation into restrictions or covenants running with the land, if sold, or as restrictions or conditions of the lease or other instrument of conveyance or use. Prior to disposition of any such public property acquired directly in connection with the Redevelopment Plan, the City or CRA shall approve conditions of control deemed appropriate at the time to facilitate the intended program, project or activity while adequately protecting the intent and objectives of the Redevelopment Plan.

RESOLUTION NO. 24-18 (CRA)

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF FORT LAUDERDALE COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY ACCEPTING THE PROPOSAL OF SEFTON AND BEVERLY CHAMBERS AND APPROVING THE SALE OF REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 724 NW 15TH WAY, FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA 33311; DELEGATING AUTHORITY TO THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO EXECUTE THE COMMERCIAL CONTRACT, ADDENDUM, CONVEYANCE INSTRUMENTS AND RELATED DOCUMENTS; DELEGATING AUTHORITY TO THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO TAKE CERTAIN ACTIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Fort Lauderdale Community Redevelopment Agency ("CRA"), an agency authorized under Chapter 163, Part III of the Florida Statutes, was created to eliminate "slum and blight" and to stimulate community redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, adopted Resolution No. 95-86 on June 2, 1995, finding the existence of slum and blight conditions in that area of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida (the "City") known as the Northwest-Progresso-Flagler Heights Community Redevelopment Area, as more particularly described in that resolution, (herein referred to as the "Redevelopment Area"); and

WHEREAS, by adoption of Resolution No. 95-170, the redevelopment plan for the Redevelopment Area was approved by the City Commission on November 7, 1995, and was amended in 2001 by Resolution No. 01-86, in 2002, by Resolution No. 02-183, in 2013, by Resolution No. 13-137, in 2016, by Resolution No. 01-86, in 2002, by Resolution No. 02-183, in 2013, by Resolution No. 13-137, in 2016, by Resolution No. 16-52 and, in 2018, by Resolution No. 18-226, and as may be subsequently amended (the "Redevelopment Plan"); and

WHEREAS, on April 4, 2024, the Fort Lauderdale Community Redevelopment Agency, published a Notice of Intent, (the "RFP") to accept proposals to dispose of CRA property, the legal description is attached hereto as Exhibit "1" (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, on May 6, 2024, the CRA received a single proposal from Sefton and Beverly Chambers for the conveyance and renovation of the existing structure; and

WHEREAS, on June 24, 2024, the RFP Evaluation Committee reviewed and scored the proposal and recommended acceptance of the proposal; and

WHEREAS, on August 13, 2024, the CRA Advisory Board unanimously recommended approval of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the CRA Board of Commissioners finds the proposal received by Sefton and Beverly Chambers demonstrates that they have the financial capacity, legal ability, development experience and qualifications to develop this Project; and

WHEREAS, the renovation of the existing structure will expand the supply of and provide affordable housing within the Redevelopment Area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE FORT LAUDERDALE COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That the Recitals set forth above are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.

SECTION 2. The governing body of the Fort Lauderdale Community Redevelopment Agency hereby approves an award and sale of the property for \$1.00, located at 724 NW 15th Way, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33311, as legally described in Exhibit "1" attached hereto, to Sefton and Beverly Chambers and authorizes execution of the Commercial Contract and Addendum, in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit "2", and any and all other documents or instruments necessary or incidental to consummation of the transaction without further action or approval of this body. In accordance with City of Fort Lauderdale Resolution No. 21-158 and Resolution No. 21-98 and Florida Statutes, Section 420.0004(3), the Property shall remain affordable in perpetuity and shall be leased to households, at affordable rents, whose family income does not exceed 120% of Broward County Area Median Income, as adjusted for family household size. These restrictions shall be set forth in a Restrictive Covenant which shall encumber the Property and constitute a covenant running with the land. Further, conveyance of the Property shall be subject to a Right of Reverter in favor of the CRA and its successors and/or assigns, which right of reverter shall be released upon completion of the renovations to the Property.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. That the governing body of the CRA delegates authority to the Executive Director and/or his or her designee to execute the Commercial Contract, Addendum, Conveyance Instruments and all other documents or instruments necessary or incidental to consummation of the transaction, including without limitation, the Quit Claim Deed and other closing documents, without further action or approval of his body. The Executive Director or his or her designee is delegated authority to negotiate additional terms and conditions, modify the terms, take further

actions, and make such further determinations he deems advisable in furtherance of the goals and objectives of the Redevelopment Plan.

Pursuant to Section 163.380(3)(a), Florida Statutes, an Invitation for Proposals SECTION 4. to develop Fort Lauderdale Community Redevelopment Agency property located at 724 NW 15th Way, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33311 (the "Property") in the Northwest-Progresso-Flagler Heights Community Redevelopment Area was published in the Sun-Sentinel. The CRA Board of Commissioners hereby ratifies and approves issuance and publication of the Invitation for Proposals to develop the Property.

That execution of the Commercial Contracts, Addendum, Conveyance SECTION 5. Instrument, and other instruments shall be subject to the approval and consent of the CRA's General Counsel.

That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon and after SECTION 6. its passage.

The "Due Diligence Period" shall be a period starting with the Effective Date of this Agreement and ending sixty (60) days thereafter. During the Due Diligence Period, Buyer shall have the absolute right, through its agents, servants, employees and contractors, to enter upon the Property for the purpose of investigation, discovery, inspection and testing of the Property, including, without limitation soil testing and boring, environmental studies or any other testing Buyer determines to be necessary or appropriate to the evaluation of the purchase and sale of the Property, including inspection as provided in paragraph 7(b) of the Contract. Seller agrees to cooperate, at no expense to Seller, in regard to Buyer's efforts to obtain all relevant information respecting the investigation, discovery and testing, providing to Buyer within ten (10) days of the Effective Date hereof copies of (i) Seller's books and records respecting any previous environmental assessments of the Property, including those books and records, owner's title insurance policy or survey in the possession of Seller or any of its agents.
- (b) In connection with such inspection, there shall be no invasive tests that can or may cause damage to the Property unless Buyer has received Seller's prior written approval of such tests. The Seller's Executive Director is authorized hereby to provide such written approval of such tests on behalf of Seller. All such entries shall be at the risk of Buyer; Seller shall have no liability for any injuries sustained by Buyer or any of Buyer's agents or contractors. Buyer agrees to repair or restore promptly any damage to the Property caused by Buyer, its agents and contractors under this Paragraph. Upon completion of Buyer's investigations and tests and in the event this transaction does not close, the Property will be restored to the same condition, as it existed before Buyer's entry upon the Property. Buyer's obligations under this Paragraph and paragraph 7 (b) of the Commercial Contract shall survive termination of this Contract.
- 5. Extension of time. In the event Buyer's investigation reveals a need for the parties to extend the times under this Contract, then either the (i) Due Diligence Period (Paragraph 7 (b) of the Commercial Contract and 4 of the Addendum), or (ii) Closing Date (¶2 of the Addendum) or both (i) or (ii) may be extended by written instrument signed by both Seller and Buyer. As to the Seller, the Seller's Executive Director shall have the authority to execute any such instrument extending time under this ¶ 6 of the Addendum, but in no event shall the extension exceed one (1) year.
- 6. Right of Cancellation. Buyer shall have the absolute and unqualified right to terminate and cancel this Contract by delivering written notice of such cancellation to Seller no later than 5:00 PM on the fifth (5th) day after the Due Diligence Period has elapsed. The right of

cancellation may be exercised upon the discovery of any condition determined to be unacceptable to Buyer in its sole discretion.

- 7. Leases. Conveyance of title to the Property shall be free of any leasehold interests or claims by persons in possession of the Property, except for N/A.
- 8. Possession and Occupancy. Other than reservation of interests and easement rights in the Property(s) in favor of the FORT LAUDERDALE COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY, the City of Fort Lauderdale, Broward County and any other governmental authority, title, use, possession and occupancy of the Property(s) shall pass to Buyer at Closing.
- 9. Personal Property. All of Seller's personal property shall be removed from the Property(s) by the Seller prior to Closing.
- 10. Service Contracts. Seller represents and acknowledges that there are no Service Contracts concerning the Property(s) and Seller will not enter into any service contracts concerning the Property(s) prior to or after the Closing which would bind Buyer or the Property(s) without the written consent of Buyer, which may not be unreasonably withheld.

11. Destruction or Condemnation of the Property(s).

- (a) In the event that all or any portion of the Property(s) is damaged or destroyed by any casualty or by a taking or condemnation under the provisions of eminent domain law after the Effective Date but prior to the Closing, Seller shall give Buyer prompt written notice of same ("Condemnation/Casualty Notice").
- (b) Within fifteen (15) days after receipt of the Condemnation/Casualty Notice, Buyer shall have the option of (i) taking the Property in "AS IS" condition at the agreed upon purchase price, together with an assignment of the insurance proceeds, if any, or (ii) terminating this Agreement, Contract and Addendum by delivery of written notice to Seller. If the Closing date falls within such fifteen (15) day period, the Closing date shall be extended until the day after the expiration of the fifteen (15) day period.
- (c) In the event Buyer elects under subsection (b)(i) above to take Property(s) in "AS IS" condition, then Seller shall, upon Closing, assign to Buyer all claims of Seller under or pursuant to any casualty insurance coverage, or under any provisions of eminent domain law, as applicable, and all proceeds from any such casualty insurance or condemnation awards received by Seller on account of any such casualty or condemnation, as the case may be (to the extent the same have not been applied by Seller prior to the Closing Date to repair the resulting damage), and there shall be no reduction in Purchase Price (except that in connection with a casualty covered by insurance, Buyer shall be credited with the lesser of the remaining cost to repair the damage or destruction caused by such casualty or the amount of the deductible under Seller's insurance policy, if any, [except to the extent such deductible was expended by Seller to repair the resulting damage].

12. Representations and Warranties.
