Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt a preliminary rate resolution setting the Non-Ad Valorem Fire Assessment Fee at \$338 per residential dwelling and establish the date of September 13, 2023 at 5:01 P.M. to hold a public hearing at The Parker, 707 Northeast 8th Street, Fort Lauderdale, FL 33304 to consider public comments.

Background

The City Commission authorized the creation of the Fire Assessment Program to fund the fire services, facilities, and/or programs that will benefit the City in its entirety, such as facility improvements, special equipment, and cost of fire suppression operations on June 15, 1999 (Ordinance C-99-49). Annually, the City establishes an assessment rate to fund continued fire services and operations for the upcoming year.

The City proposes a \$338 per residential dwelling unit, which is an increase of \$17 per Residential Dwelling Unit over last year. For FY 2024, the proposed assessment is \$55,095,989 which is estimated to generate \$52,892,149 in revenue to the General Fund. Based on historical information, the staff projects a 96% collection rate.

The City Manager is required per Section 197.3632 (5)(a), Florida Statutes to certify the non-ad valorem assessment rate to the Broward County Tax Collector no later than September 15, 2023.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action. The revenue estimate is included in the FY 2024 proposed budget.
