Homeland Security, Urban Area Security Initiative, State of Florida
Division of Emergency Management through the City of Miami, FY 2022
Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI), for \$454,516 - **(Commission
Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)**

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission approve the acceptance of grants funds from the United States Department of Homeland Security (USDHS) and the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management for \$454,516; and authorize the City Manager to execute any documents needed to accept the funds.

Background

The United States Department of Homeland Security (USDHS) has provided financial assistance to the Miami urban area in the amount of \$14,012,500 through the FY 2022 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Grant Program. The urban area is defined as Miami and Fort Lauderdale collectively. The sponsoring and coordinating agency, is the City of Miami via a memorandum of agreement.

The City of Fort Lauderdale has received a sub-grant in the amount of \$454,516 with no required match and is a reimbursement grant. Funds will be used towards Emergency Operations Center Sustainment and Resiliency Project (\$67,881); **Ft. Lauderdale Police Department Fixed License Plate Readers (\$100,000)**; Ft. Lauderdale Fire Rescue Hazmat Team monitors (\$71,650); Ft. Lauderdale Fire Rescue Technical Rescue Team Vehicle and Trench Equipment (\$69,985); Ft. Lauderdale Fire Rescue Station 35 Facility Security Enhancement (\$45,000) and Regional Citizen Corp training, symposium, and drills (\$100,000). The grant period began September 1, 2022, and ends December 31, 2024.

Resource Impact

This action will result in a positive impact to the city for \$454,516. This item is contingent upon the approval of the Consolidated Budget Amendment CAM 23-0341.
