TITLE: Motion Authorizing Professional Services for New Pump Station Sewer Redirection – Craven Thompson & Associates, Inc. – \$181,470 Task Order

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a Task Order (Exhibit 1) with Craven Thompson & Associates, Inc. for pump station and sewer design services in the amount of \$181,470.

Background

This project involves the installation of 1,600 linear feet of new gravity sanitary sewer, 350 linear feet of force main, and a new pump station. Ongoing and future redevelopment east of Federal Highway between Northeast 3rd Street, Victoria Park Road, and Las Olas Boulevard necessitates a new pump station to be constructed to handle the newly diverted capacity of one million gallons per day (1 MGD) of wastewater.

The Task Order is being entered into pursuant to the continuing contract for civil engineering consultant services (Contract 626-10881) with Craven Thompson & Associates, Inc., in accordance with the terms of the amended master agreement dated November 6, 2012 (CAR #12-2299) and renewed on October 21, 2014 (CAM #14-1066).

Resource Impact

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$181,470 for the Task Order and \$18,147 for in house project management fees, for a total of \$199,617.
