### Recommendation

Staff recommends the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) Board of Commissioners approve the transfer of the Northwest-Progresso-Flagler Heights (NPF) year-end estimated operating and incentive budget balances to the existing Community Investment Plan (CIP) Projects.

## **Background**

Florida Statutes, Section 163.387 (7), which governs Community Redevelopment Agency trust funds, requires all unspent funds on the last day of the fiscal year be moved to an allowable expense, including:

- (a) Returned to each taxing authority which paid the increment in the proportion that the amount of the payment of such taxing authority bears to the total amount paid into the trust fund by all taxing authorities for that year.
- (b) Used to reduce the amount of any indebtedness to which increment revenues are pledged.
- (c) Deposited into an escrow account for the purpose of later reducing any indebtedness to which increment revenues are pledged.
- (d) Appropriated to a specific redevelopment project pursuant to an approved community redevelopment plan.

To comply with the above statute, staff recommends the following budget transfer to CIP projects as follows:

The Northwest-Progresso-Flagler Heights CRA FY 2023 year-end estimated operating budget balance of \$514,400, and Incentive balances of \$7,366,600; \$6,000,000 deposited to the New Carter Park Senior Center for walking trails, lighting, signage, parking, playground, sidewalk turf replacement and other normal and customary park uses. The remaining \$1,881,000 deposited to the NPF

Streetscape Improvement Project to remove blight, improve safety and help activate the area for the community's benefit.
