Commissioner Sturman remarked on concerns related to the timeline and repair of the South Ocean Drive Bridge (Bridge) raised by residents of Harbor Beach and Harbor Inlet (Neighborhoods).

In response to Commissioner Sturman's questions, Ben Rogers, Transportation and Mobility Department Director, provided a recap of details related to the Bridge repair. Mr. Rogers discussed concerns regarding the condition of the Bridge, project delays, and timelines. Some funding for the project will come from the Broward County Surtax (Surtax). It includes an additional funding request to address the increase to construction costs due to inflation, which have been memorialized in an agreement containing deliverables and critical dates.

Commissioner Sturman provided a summary of discussions with City Manager Chavarria related to options for Bridge repairs, including lane closures and the impact of accommodating traffic during Bridge repair. Mr. Rogers confirmed and explained related information. The Neighborhoods have acknowledged the need for a full closure of the Bridge for repairs.

Commissioner Sturman remarked on holiday and seasonal traffic congestion. He discussed needs associated with the approval of this Agenda item, including requiring Staff to coordinate input from all stakeholders, including the Neighborhoods, and City Staff mitigating concerns for access to the Neighborhoods by Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and First Responders, residents, and delivery services. Commissioner Sturman discussed additional concerns related to Pier 66

Mr. Rogers said substantial progress had been made to address Commissioner Sturman's concerns, noted related discussions with Staff to mitigate, and expounded on details. Staff will continue to work with the Neighborhoods.

Mayor Trantalis remarked on increased costs associated with project delays. In response to Mayor Trantalis' question, Mr. Rogers noted his understanding that the Bridge project is scheduled to begin in the December 2023 - January 2024 time frame.

In response to Commissioner Glassman's questions, Alan Dodd, Public Works Department Director, said the most recent 2014 Bridge Master Plan (Master Plan) is a little outdated. This Bridge was in the first five-year tranche scheduled for 2019. Staff is seeking additional grant funding through the State of Florida (State) to augment funding for bridge repair and replacement needs identified in the Master Plan and explained related information. Further comment and discussion ensued. Mr. Dodd said he did not believe the Master Plan goals would be achieved as planned over the twenty (20) year timeline, but there is a path moving forward to accelerate bridge repair and replacement with the assistance of additional funding.

Commissioner Glassman inquired about potential funding assistance from the Federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (Act). Mr. Dodd commented on related discussions with Daphnee Sainvil, Public Affairs Manager.

Mayor Trantalis recommended addressing this topic with the City's federal lobbyists and having them present a document outlining related opportunities and provide comprehensive alternatives. Further comment and discussion ensued.

Mr. Dodd explained that federal funding requests flow through the State and discussed related information. Further comment and discussion ensued.

Mayor Trantalis recognized Daphnee Sainvil, who confirmed the flow of federal funding is through the State and from the federal level. The federal lobbyist sends her grant opportunities for various infrastructure programs, which she forwards to Department Directors. She remarked on related funding information and expounded on details.

Mayor Trantalis remarked on several visits to Washington, DC, and meetings with the U.S. Department of Transportation regarding infrastructure funding opportunities and requested a report from federal lobbyists about available opportunities. Ms. Sainvil confirmed she will ask the City's lobbyist to present to the Commission. Further comment and discussion ensued.

Mr. Rogers remarked on a recent grant opportunity related to bridges and the forty-five (45) to sixty (60) day window to apply for funding. He confirmed Staff will move forward and apply for infrastructure funding for the Sospiro Canal Bridge on Las Olas Boulevard.

In response to Commissioner Sturman's question, Stephanie Toothaker, Esq., on behalf of Tavistock Group - Pier 66, confirmed she would participate in discussions with Mr. Rogers and Harbor Inlet neighbors regarding Pier 66 workers parking and explained related information.

Commissioner Sturman made a motion to approve this Agenda item and was seconded by Commissioner Glassman.

Commissioner Sturman described what transpired during the Commission discussion after his review of the meeting video. Further comment and discussion ensued.

Interim City Attorney D'Wayne Spence described his viewpoint of what transpired and explained the proper procedure to address Commissioner Sturman's concerns. Further comment and discussion ensued. Commissioner Herbst noted his objections to Mayor Trantalis' restating his motion. Mayor Trantalis recalled his recollection of what transpired and explained the adoption of the Resolution in its substantial form allowed the opportunity for Commissioner Herbst to meet with representatives of the Hall of Fame Partners, LLC, and make minor changes to the Comprehensive Agreement. Commissioner Herbst reiterated that his objection should have been recognized. Further comment and discussion ensued.

Interim City Attorney Spence explained the proper procedure to address this issue is for a Commission Member from the prevailing side to make a motion to reconsider.

Commissioner Sturman remarked on the importance of following proper procedures as outlined in Roberts Rules of Order, explained his viewpoint, and discussed his review of the video showing what transpired at the September 19, 2023, Commission Regular Meeting. Further comment and discussion ensued.

Interim City Attorney Spence said the Commission uses Roberts Rules of Order as a guide. He reviewed what transpired during the Commission discussion of Agenda item 23-0723 and explained procedures to correctly object to an action of the Commission. He reiterated the ability of those on the prevailing side to entertain a motion

to reconsider. Further comment and discussion ensued.

Commissioner Sturman noted that according to Roberts Rules of Order, the Mayor or Chair of a committee cannot advance a resolution or a motion. Interim City Attorney Spence noted the Mayor or Chair of a committee is responsible for clarifying what is being voted on. Commissioner Sturman reiterated his viewpoint and explained related information.

Interim City Attorney Spence explained Mayor Trantalis' clarification of what was being voted on was different from the Resolution as amended which Commissioner Herbst had introduced.

Commissioner Glassman remarked on the reason for requesting clarification during that Resolution vote and expounded on his viewpoint.

Commissioner Herbst explained that he would not call this Agenda item up for reconsideration as he had met with the team, and his concerns had been alleviated.

Commissioner Herbst thanked Commissioner Sturman for pointing out the importance of adhering to proper meeting procedures during Commission Meetings. He recommended the City adopt Robert's Rules of Order to ensure consistency, explained his reasoning, and suggested presenting this recommendation to the Charter Revision Board.
