Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve Work Order No. 6 in the amount of \$27,042.40 under the Annual Storm Drainage Contract with GPE Engineering & General Contractor Corp. for the drainage project at Northeast 23rd Street at North Ocean Boulevard in the amount of \$27,042.40 (Exhibit 2).

Background

In compliance with Section 2-179(5) of the City Code of Ordinances, all work orders under an annual contract in a cumulative amount over \$25,000 must be brought back to the City Commission for review and approval.

On January 8, 2013, the City Commission awarded an annual contract for construction of various storm drainage projects throughout the City via CAM 12-2514 (Exhibit 3). Projects include the restoration, testing, and installation of storm pipelines, storm basins, manholes, exfiltration trenches, storm drainage wells, and other storm water drainage components.

Work Order No. 6, in the amount of \$27,042.40, is for work where stormwater street runoff is causing beach erosion issues since it is the lowest point within the general topography of the area.

Resource Impact

There is an estimated fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$27,042.40 for this work order, and \$2,704.60 for engineering fees, for a total amount of \$29,747.00.
