TITLE: Resolution Authorizing the Acceptance and Execution of Amendment

Number Two of the Joint Participation Agreement Financial Management (FM) Number 424027-2-58-01 with Florida Department of Transportation for State Road A1A Pedestrian Light Installation (Commission District 2)

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the City Commission adopt a resolution accepting Amendment Number Two (2) updating Exhibit B in the Agreement of the Joint Participation Agreement (JPA), FM 424027-2-58-01, with a value of \$1,568,621 for the construction of pedestrian lighting on the west side of State Road (SR) A1A from the north end of the South Beach Parking Lot entrance to Sunrise Boulevard; and authorize the execution of this Amendment, in substantially the form attached, on behalf of the City.

Background

In June of 2009, the City executed a \$3,290,702 JPA with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) for the installation of pedestrian lights on the east side of SR A1A. The City was able to achieve cost savings on that completed project and did not utilize all the FDOT JPA funds. The City obtained approval from FDOT in April 2016 to use the remaining \$1,568,621 FDOT JPA fund balance for the installation of pedestrian lighting on the west side of SR A1A. On September 22, 2022, the Commission accepted Amendment Number One (1) of the JPA, extending the term to December 31, 2023, due to supply chain issues (CAM #22-0788).

The pedestrian lights on the west side of SR A1A are part of the City's SR A1A Beach Streetscape Improvement Project. There are no pedestrian lights on the west side of SR A1A, and the existing SR A1A roadway lights are turned off during the sea turtle nesting period each year from March 1 through October 31. The proposed pedestrian lights will have a dual lighting fixture that will provide white light during turtle non-nesting season and provide amber light during turtle nesting season.

The amendment of JPA is necessary to reflect changes in the deliverables exhibit. The original executed construction contract with Weekley Asphalt Paving, Inc. was awarded on December 6, 2022 (CAM #22-1094).

There is no current fiscal impact for this item.
