Current zoning ordinance prohibits all residents from keeping backyard hens.

The FTL Hen Project wants to spread the word on how backyard hens:

- Can be a critical part of sustainable, small-scale home agriculture;
- Are good for the environment, reducing dependence on chemical fertilizers, fossil fuels, and factory farming;
- Produce eggs that are both superior in taste and nutrition;
- Produce excellent fertilizer for your home garden and lawn;
- Can be raised in urban settings without negatively impacting neighbors.

Many, many major American cities currently allow hen-keeping! This includes Portland, Raleigh, New York City, San Diego, San Francisco, Berkeley, Seattle, Los Angeles, Baltimore, Boston, DC, Miami and Chicago.
