Based Rental Assistance Program and Supportive Services - Housing Opportunities, Mortgage Assistance, & Effective Neighborhood Solutions,

Inc. d/b/a H.O.M.E.S., Inc. - \$250,000 - (Commission Districts 3)

## **Recommendation**

Staff recommends the City Commission approve an Agreement, in substantially the form attached, with Housing Opportunities, Mortgage Assistance, & Effective Neighborhood Solutions, Inc. d/b/a H.O.M.E.S., Inc. to award HOME Investment Partnerships Program - American Rescue Plan (HOME-ARP) funds, in the amount of \$250,000 for the development and operation of a Tenant Based Rental Assistance Program and Supportive Services.

#### **Background**

Congress appropriated \$5 billion in ARP funds to be administered through HOME to address the need for homelessness assistance and supportive services. On April 28, 2021, the City was awarded HOME-ARP funds in the amount of \$2,589,019. These funds must be used for qualifying individuals or families from the following Qualifying Populations: homeless; at-risk of homelessness; fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence; dating violence; sexual assault; stalking, or human trafficking; other populations whereby assistance would prevent the family's homelessness or would serve those with the greatest risk of housing instability; and veterans and families that include a veteran family member that meet one of the proceeding criteria.

HOME-ARP funds can be used for four eligible activities including:

- Development and support of affordable housing
- Tenant-based rental assistance
- Provision of supportive services
- Acquisition and development of non-congregate shelter units

The HOME-ARP funds awarded to H.O.M.E.S., Inc. will be used for supportive services (\$100,000) and tenant-based rental assistance (\$150,000) for qualifying populations.

05/07/2024 CAM #24-0408 On December 12, 2023, the Procurement Services Division issued Request for Proposals (RFP) No. 224 – HOME-ARP Tenant Based Rental & Supportive Services which closed on January 15, 2024. The RFP closed with one (1) firm responding:

1. Housing Opportunities, Mortgage Assistance, & Effective Neighborhood Solutions, Inc. d/b/a H.O.M.E.S., Inc.

Additional market outreach was conducted with the vendors that showed interest in the solicitation but did not submit a proposal. The reasons given for not submitting a proposal include: non-eligibility, inability to satisfy the scope of services, and concerns regarding the administrative costs.

On March 6, 2024, the Evaluation Committee met to evaluate the proposal from H.O.M.E.S., Inc. to ensure it met the evaluation criteria.

The proposal was evaluated based on the evaluation criteria shown in the table below:

H.O.M.E.S., Inc. is a certified Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO) with a successful track record of developing and operating housing for low-income households for over 20 years.

The proposal from H.O.M.E.S., Inc. met all the requirements and was deemed responsive and responsible. Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) is not a requirement for this solicitation.
