TITLE: Motion Authorizing Professional Services relating to Sanitary Sewer Pump
Station D-37 Replacement – Calvin Giordano & Associates, Inc. – \$78,925
Task Order

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a task order for construction observation and inspection services for the sanitary sewer pump station D-37 replacement with Calvin, Giordano & Associates, Inc. in the amount of \$78,925.

Background

Pump Station D-37, located at 301 Lido Drive, is a master station that serves as the collection point for the Las Olas Isles Neighborhood and is a critical part of the City's sanitary sewer infrastructure. As part of this project, the existing pump station will be demolished and a new in-ground triplex (three pumps) submersible pump station will be constructed. In addition to the increased capacity of the new pump station, benefits from this project include architectural improvements to the pump house, site improvements, and the installation of a new generator.

This project is a result of ongoing coordination efforts between Public Works and the Department of Sustainable Development to accommodate growth without sacrificing services to our neighbors in Las Olas Isles.

On October 21, 2014 the City Commission approved a one year extension with Calvin, Giordano & Associates, Inc. for civil engineering consulting services (CAM 14-1066, RFQ 626-10881). The scope of services for this task order includes, but is not limited to, assisting with daily inspections, specialty inspections for electrical, structural, and architectural work, testing verification, and monitoring the progress of the work for compliance with the contract documents during the construction phase of the project.

Resource Impact

There is a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$78,925 for this task order and \$7,892 for estimated in-house project management fees, for a total of \$86,817.
