TITLE: Public Hearing – Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program

Substantial Amendment

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission convene a public hearing to receive input and approve the Substantial Amendment pursuant to **Exhibit 1** to the 2012-2013 and the 2013-2014 Annual Action Plans of the 2010-2015 Consolidated Plans.

Background

In accordance with the Substantial Change Policy of the City's Housing and Urban Development (HUD) approved Consolidated Plans, this change requires a program amendment to the Annual Action Plan of the Consolidated Plans. A change in a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program as a result of the addition or cancellation of a program or a change in the purpose, scope, location or beneficiary of an activity, requires a program amendment to the Annual Action Plan of the Consolidated Plan. The City of Fort Lauderdale's program amendment and substantial change policy requires Commission Approval and public input at a public hearing after proper notice has been published for a 30-day public comment period.

The reallocation of CDBG funds is recommended for the following projects and activities that will assist the Housing and Community Development (HCD) Division in meeting the City's federal spending requirements.

South Middle River Unpaved Road Project

This neighborhood improvement project is for the purpose of paving unimproved right of ways. The proposed plan is to construct 12' wide one-way roads along NW 15th Street from Powerline Road east to Andrews Avenue. The proposed plan includes new sidewalks, landscaping, bioswales and solar pedestrian lighting.

Staff recommends making the program amendments listed above to reallocate CDBG Funds. In 2013-2014 the City Commission approved funding for the Public Works Department. Public Works will combine the \$353,553.84 that has already been set aside for Public Works projects with the \$246,446.16 in this CAM for this project.

At the time that the program advertisement was published, it was the intention to utilize \$800,000 of CDBG funds for this project. However, during the FY15 budget process additional non-CDBG funding was identified for the project. After the allocation to the South Middle River Unpaved Road Project, there remains approximately \$200,000 of program income that can be allocated to existing programs or new programs which meet the CDBG eligibility criteria.

Resource Impact

CDBG funds have already been appropriated by the City. This CAM has no fiscal impact to the general fund. Funding will be reallocated as follows:
