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## Section A

- 1. Summary of the proposed ordinance, to include the public purpose to be served by the proposed ordinance, such as serving the public health, safety, morals, and welfare of the City. The proposed amendment to Chapter 17 Noise Control aims to establish a balanced approach to noise regulation in the City. It seeks to enhance the administration and enforcement of the Noise Control Program, ensuring that businesses can operate effectively while maintaining a reasonable noise comfort level for residents. This initiative serves the public purpose of protecting the health, safety, morals, and welfare of the community by addressing noise concerns and fostering a harmonious environment for both businesses and residents.
- 2. Estimate of direct economic impact of the proposed ordinance on private, for-profit businesses in the City.

The fees related to the enforcement of Chapter 17 - Noise Control are detailed in Chapter 11 - Code Enforcement of the City's Code of Ordinances. These fees are not new.
