PROJECT SUMMARY NARRATIVE (Please summarize the project in 2 paragraphs or less.)

As of November 2012 all of the 18 outboard motors in the FLPD's Marine Units fleet were 5 years old, out of warranty and had logged in excess of 2,700 hours. The fact that all of the Marine Unit's engines are the same age, and bear the same amount of wear and tear, has also made the development of a viable replacement plan for marine equipment more difficult. Given the City's budgetary constraints, in FY 2012-2013 the Police Department was only granted funding to replace our two oldest sets of marine engines, further hampering efforts to overhaul our fleet.

Given the condition of our existing motors and the City's budgetary constraints, the City of Fort Lauderdale Police Department is requesting \$30,000 in FY 2013Waterway Assistance Program grant funds to purchase one (1) set of two (2) outboard motors. The requested motors would be used to replace the third oldest set of our existing 2007 motors. The Department proposes to meet the grants required 50% cash match by purchasing a second set of out board motors. The FLPD believes that with the assistance of this grant, the purchase of these motors will enable the Department: to replace motors which have reached the end of their useful life; reduce related maintenance costs; and, ensure our ability to provide reliable marine law enforcement patrols of the ICW and the expansive network of adjoining waterways.
