TITLE: Motion to approve a contract for processing of program recyclable
services – Request for Proposal (RFP) 635-11066 - \$2,228,000
(estimated ten-year revenue total)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a ten-year contract with two (2) five-year renewal extensions for processing of program recyclable services with top ranked proposer Waste Management, Inc. of Florida in the estimated annual revenue amount of \$222,800 and in the ten-year estimated revenue amount of \$2,228,000, and authorize the City Manager to approve all renewal options.

Background

In 2010, the City of Fort Lauderdale adopted a Sustainability Action Plan (SAP) that articulates long-term, community-responsive strategies to help our City become more sustainable. The SAP includes agendas on several fronts including, but not limited to, climate resiliency, resource conservation, responsible land use, transportation choices and others. In the area of recycling and waste reduction, a key goal set forth in the SAP is to increase recycling rates by 50% by the year 2020.

On July 2, 2013, the City of Fort Lauderdale (City) will end its contractual relationship with Broward County for garbage disposal and recyclables processing. As part of the current RFP, the City is interested in evaluating the highest and best use of its waste stream given today's technology and need for sustainable solutions. Upon exiting from this Interlocal Agreement (ILA), the City is seeking to procure a contractor, or multiple contractors, that will operate a designated receiving facility for the City's residential recyclables. The designated receiving facility must be located within fifteen (15) driving miles of City Hall.

On January 23, 2013 the City received a proposal from Waste Management, Inc. of Florida in response to RFP 635-11066 for the processing of program recyclables. Refer to Exhibit 1, RFP Price Tabulation.

On February 8, 2013 the proposal was evaluated and ranked by a committee of two City employees, Albert Carbon, the then Director of Public Works and Julie Leonard, Deputy Director of Public Works-Utilities; and City of Oakland Park Director of Public Works, Kenneth Resor. Waste Management Inc. of Florida (WMIF) was the top ranked proposer for processing of program recyclable services. Refer to Exhibit 2, Evaluation Committee Tabulation and Scoring Sheets.

Resource Impact

There will be a positive fiscal impact to the City in the estimated annual amount of \$222,800.
