\$4,275 to the Florida Inland Navigation District – Small Scale Derelict Vessel Removal Program to Remove a Derelict Vessel from the Cox's

Landing Boat Ramp - (Commission District 4)

### Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to submit an application for grant funding of \$4,275 to the Florida Inland Navigation District – Small Scale Derelict Vessel Removal program. This Grant requires a City match of \$1,425.

## **Background**

The Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) administers the Waterway Assistance Program (WAP) program. FIND provides funding assistance to local governments within the District to provide public access to area waterways through boat ramps, floating docks and derelict vessel removal.

A 28' vessel was abandoned at the Cox's Landing Boat Ramp and the City of Fort Lauderdale Police Marine Unit deemed the vessel abandoned and authorized the City to remove the vessel on May 2, 2023. On May 17, 2023, Sea Tow Fort Lauderdale removed the derelict vessel for the City at a cost of \$5,700.

The Florida Inland Navigation District Small Scale Derelict Vessel Removal Program will fund up to 75%, or in this case \$4,275 of the costs needed to salvage and properly dispose of this derelict vessel. The remaining costs of \$1,425 to remove the vessel will be funded by a Broward County Boating Improvement Derelict Vessel Removal Grant which was awarded to the City in 2019.

#### Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with the grant application. The Grant will be brought back to the City Commission for execution and appropriation if awarded.
