FY 2027 City Commission Priorities

- Public Safety
- Homelessness Response
- Infrastructure and Resilience
- Public Spaces and Thriving Communities

Public Safety

- Explore opportunities to continue and expand the Gun Violence Intervention Program
- Pursue ways to address concerns related to e-bikes
- Consider the addition of cameras and license plate readers throughout the City

Homelessness Response

- Deter panhandling at targeted intersections
- Connect those experiencing homelessness with available shelter beds
- Partner more closely with nonprofit agencies (e.g., a bus that transports individuals to key services)
- Provide more frequent updates on efforts to address homelessness that can be shared with the community

Infrastructure and Resilience

Flood Mitigation and Utilities

- Continue to advance Fortify Lauderdale
- Accelerate the construction of seawall improvement projects
- Enhance communication with the community on key infrastructure improvement projects through a variety of methods in addition to social media (e.g., direct mail, water bills)

Transportation and Traffic

- Advance planning for the Las Olas Mobility Project
- Address the root causes of sinkholes in roadways
- Coordinate cross-functional efforts (e.g., roadways, utilities) when implementing City improvement projects
- Ensure external contractors (e.g., Florida Power and Light) restore roadways and sidewalks once work is completed
- Continue to advocate for a commuter rail tunnel
- Address navigational challenges associated with illegal parking and delivery trucks
- Investigate opportunities for implementing traffic calming measures

Public Spaces and Thriving Communities

- Create opportunities for every child to learn to swim at an affordable cost
- Discourage illegal dumping and pumpouts into waterways
- Continue progress to improve median landscaping and maintenance
- Accelerate public art installations
- Incentivize business operators to increase the amenities offered in areas throughout the City as needed (e.g., grocery stores, salons, dry cleaners)
- Continue to advance economic development programs to attract and retain businesses
- Enhance communication with civic associations and the broader community
- Market the City under a unified brand to attract new residents, visitors, and businesses
- Expand broadband access including training initiatives for neighbors
