TITLE: Motion to Approve a Revised Installation and Maintenance of Landscape

Agreement with Broward County

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a motion authorizing the proper City officials to execute a revised Installation and Maintenance of Landscaping Agreement with Broward County as part of the Broward Boulevard Livable Mobility Grant between Andrews Avenue and State Road 7.

Background

In July 2012, the City Commission approved an Installation and Maintenance of Landscaping Agreement between Broward County and the City of Fort Lauderdale (CAM 12-1087, Exhibit 1) in connection with the County's' receipt of the Broward Boulevard Livable Mobility Grant.

As part of the original agreement (Exhibit 2), Broward County agreed to install, at its cost, landscaping with the required permitting in the right-of-way along Broward Boulevard from Andrews Avenue to State Road 7. In addition, the City's Parks & Recreation Department agreed to maintain the area with a contractor and existing City staff.

Broward County Transit has revised the agreement (Exhibit 3). New terms of this agreement are identified in Section 8.16, Prior Agreements:

COUNTY and MUNICIPALITY have previously entered into an Interlocal Agreement Among Broward County, City of Plantation, and City of Fort Lauderdale Relating to Beautification Project along Broward Boulevard From State Road 7 to Northwest 7th Avenue, dated October 14,1997 ("Beautification Agreement"). Nothing in this Agreement is intended to modify the terms of the Beautification Agreement among COUNTY. MUNICIPALITY and the City of Plantation and the Beautification Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

At the April 15, 2014 Commission Meeting, the City Commission approved a revised Installation and Maintenance of Landscaping Agreement with Broward County. After Commission approval, the agreement was further revised by Broward County with changes to portions of the Insurance Language and the Insurance Certificate. Specifically, sections 7.2.2 to 7.2.5 were eliminated.

The City's Risk Management office has reviewed and approved the revised insurance requirements in the agreement.

The Parks & Recreation Department is currently maintaining the area with a contractor and existing City staff so there is no budget impact.

Resource Impact

There is no financial impact associated with this item.
