RE: Response to the Proposed Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program Amendment

Dear Mr. Brown:

This letter is in response to your Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Proposed Program Amendment, as noticed in the Sun-Sentinel on October 25, 2014. In 2014, the City of Fort Lauderdale allocated \$160,000 to CareerSource Broward (CSBD) for its Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) to provide 64 low-income youth with a summer work experience. Previous years we were able to serve 70 youth with the same amount of funding, but last year the minimum wage went up and we had to lower the amount of youth we could serve down to 64. Effective January 2015, the minimum wage will increase to \$8.05, which will further lower the amount of youth served by this program to approximately 57 youth in Fort Lauderdale. As a result, CSBD requests the \$24,539.67, as line itemed "To Be Determined" in the proposed amendment per your public notice, to be allocated to our Summer Youth Employment Program to serve approximately 67 youth.

Over the past five (5) years, the City of Fort Lauderdale has supported and funded our Summer Youth Employment Program and given youth that reside in Fort Lauderdale the opportunity to experience meaningful work during an 8-week period. The youth actually work within the boundaries of the city at various parks, libraries, City Hall, fire stations and schools. For majority of the youth, this will be their first work experience, so the SYEP program provides an employability skills training over a three-day period to all participants, which covers basic soft skills, such as: (1) communicating with the supervisor; (2) the importance of arriving on time; (3) appropriate workplace dress attire; (4) getting along with co–workers, and; (5) appropriate workplace behavior. CSBD hires worksite monitors to provide support to the youth and employers for the duration of the program.



Allocating an additional \$24,539.67 in funding to our SYEP would allow us to serve more youth from low-income households, so they can participate in a meaningful work experience. It will also enable them to have funds for school clothing, school supplies and to help with any family needs. This additional funding will help us serve approximately 67 youth.

We look forward to hearing about this terrific opportunity to collaborate and serve more youth in our community.
