**TITLE**: Resolution Approving the Acceptance of the 2024-2025 State Housing

Initiatives Partnership (SHIP) Funds; Authorize Use of Program Income; Approve Allocation of Ship Funds for Administrative Costs - (**Commission** 

**Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)** 

## **Recommendation**

Staff recommends the City Commission approve a resolution accepting SHIP funds in the amount of One Million Four Hundred Thirty-Two Thousand Nine Hundred Twenty (\$1,432,920) as shown in Exhibit 1 and permit staff to use 10% of these funds for administrative costs along with 5% of any program income earned. The estimated program income (PI) is \$50,000. Staff further recommends that the City Commission authorize the City Manager to execute all documents associated with the acceptance of the SHIP 2024-2025 award.

## **Background**

On June 24, 2024, Florida Housing Finance Corporation (FHFC) notified the City via email of the estimated 2024-2025 SHIP Funding award. The estimated program income will be \$50,000 resulting in a total of \$1,482,920 for affordable housing.

Florida Administrative Code 67.37.005 requires that SHIP funds be advertised at least 30 days before the beginning of the application period unless a waiting list of applicants exists that will exhaust all allocated funding (Exhibit 2).

SHIP funds must be allocated to specific strategies. These strategies may overlap so for example, funds for homeownership activities may also count towards eligible construction activities. SHIP guidelines require that a minimum of 65 percent of the funds must be spent on eligible homeownership activities; a minimum of 75 percent of funds must be spent on eligible construction activities; at least 30 percent of the funds must be reserved for very-low income households (up to 50 percent of the current area median income or AMI); an additional 30 percent must be reserved for low income households (up to 80 percent of AMI and the remaining funds are used at the discretion of the local jurisdiction.

Program Income can be used for any strategy approved in the current SHIP Local Housing Assistance Plan (LHAP). Additionally, Housing and Community Development Staff recommends that any program income be expended on strategies included in the approved 2022-2025 SHIP Local Housing Assistance Plan (LHAP) (Exhibit 3).

Fifteen percent (15%) of the allocated amount and any earned program income is available for rental assistance including Rapid Re-housing, Rental Development, and Rental Assistance for the Elderly.

The Affordable Housing Advisory Committee (AHAC) proposes the following allocations for the SHIP funds for FY 2024-2025 in the amount of \$1,482,920. (Exhibit 4).

In addition, projected PI of \$50,000 and any additional earned PI will be utilized in approved strategy areas where there is a funding short fall.

# **Resource Impact**

This action will result in a positive impact to the City in the amount of \$1,432,920 in SHIP funding and projected program income of \$50,000, for a total of \$1,482,920. Funds for this program will be appropriated to the accounts below contingent upon the approval of the Consolidated Budget Amendment CAM 24-0325.
